

**First phase of the Bulldozer Committee presented in Jajce**

## **Reforms for New Jobs**

[P.04] JAJCE – In a cold production hall of a factory of alloy wheels in Jajce, businessmen and politicians from both entities yesterday were informed about the first 50 reform proposals of the Bulldozer Committee that should “clear up” bureaucratic roadblocks from BiH economy.

Committee representatives presented to the gathered businessmen a brochure with detailed description of the first 50 reforms that should create conditions for job creation and attracting of investments to BiH.

According to Committee coordinators, they intentionally chose the production hall of the “Alloy Wheels” factory for the promotion, one of the few such factories in BiH that export the total number of 500 000 wheels annually.

“Example of this factory is the future of BiH”, Donald Hays, Principal Deputy High Representative said, adding that BiH economy was recovering, but not quickly enough, which is why the Bulldozer Committee is needed.

According to the FBiH Prime Minister, Ahmet Hadzipasic, the goal of the Committee is to create a single economic space in BiH. He mentioned the initiative of the FBiH government to change location of sales tax collection and define the minimum labor price.

“With these initiatives, we would create conditions for job creation, without reduction of budget revenues,” Hadzipasic said.

According to Dragan Mikerevic, RS Prime Minister, 22 out of 50 Bulldozer measures apply to the RS. The biggest problem is reforms in the field of finance, he added.

“We are aware that we have to continue reducing taxes but, at the same time, we have to be very sensitive in the process, primarily because of public expenditures”, Mikerevic said.
